****REMINDER****

This is to remind you that there will be a performance tomorrow evening (Thursday, October 12) of The Bread and Puppet Theatre in Commons Theatre at 8:00 p.m.

The Bread and Puppet Theatre was started by Peter Schumann in 1962. The group marks an innovation in the Theatre of Protest. Schumann fills the stage with life size puppets and masked actors. His images come from the idiom of fairy tale and medieval allegory but their powerful meaning is topical and immediate.

The Bread and Puppet Theatre has performed in Peace Demonstrations in New York and Washington. The shows take place in New York's streets and in a little theatre in Delancey Street. Through the use of dumbshows, pageants and puppetry the Theatre has tried "to bypass language and lay a penetrating imagination on the hand of war."

Tickets are available at the Cooperative Store starting this afternoon. Because The Bread and Puppet Theatre can perform only one evening, tickets will be limited to one per student and one each for faculty or administration and spouse. Children ten years of age or younger will be admitted without a ticket, but must sit either on the floor or on their parents' laps. This is requested so as many people as possible may be accommodated.
