THE LEGHORN HAT

Labiche's "Leghorn Hat", now about one hundred years old, is one of the most famous and popular farces of the French nineteenth century theatre. It has been produced all over the world and in a wide variety of styles. Rene Clair, for instance, made a leisurely and nostalgic film of it, shortly before World War II; and as a musical comedy called "Horse Eats Hat", with music by Virgil Thompson, it was one of the most successful productions of the Federal Theatre.

Compared with French comedy of the best period --- Moliere or even Mariveaux --- "The Leghorn Hat" is rather wooden and naive; yet it has, especially in the handling of the wedding party, a certain simple effectiveness, like that of "primitive" or folk art. This is the quality which the present production tries to bring out, with settings, costumes and staging inspired by the painting of the Douanier Rousseau.
