Dear Ms. Chamier:

Thank you for your letter of April 3rd enclosing the bill for storage of Patrick Heron's prints at the London Airport. I am glad to hear that Patrick's prints arrived safely. But I do not think that the college can be held responsible for the inefficiency of the shippers or the failure of the airport personnel to notify you. I must add that the exhibition of Patrick's prints has already been extraordinarily expensive due to someone's failure to address the prints correctly in London resulting in their storage by Airborne Freight at Kennedy Airport in New York on their arrival. Airborne denies responsibility for this delay. There was the further expense of special handling to retrieve them in time for the opening, the further expense of posting bond at short notice, not to mention the high charge made for the construction of a carton to carry the prints. I would suggest that you ask the shipping agents, ~~Stedman~~ and Slater in Albany, N.Y. or Emery Airfreight to pay the storage charges since they were the result of their inefficiency and occurred during the period that the Heron prints were in their care.
