- Welcome back from sabbatical and welcome to new visiting faculty
- Faculty searches:
 - o announcement of Ursula Wolz as the new computer science hire
 - encouragement of participation during the candidate visits for the search for the director and curator of Usdan Gallery

- A position for writing will be moving to the search phase in the coming weeks.
- Sven Birkerts, the director of the Bennington Writing Seminars, will be stepping down
 after the residency this June. He will continue on as faculty after a year-long sabbatical.
 A search will be launched in the coming weeks to fill the position.
- Streamlining faculty communications
 - Addresses the volume of emails sent to faculty, the avenues for communication will be streamlined to Faculty Notes, the Academic Minute, Bennington Bulletin, College Week, and the website Events Calendar.

- Susan Sgorbati reported on the College's participation in the Consortium on Forced Migration,
 Displacement and Education.
- Follow up to Monday's return day sessions: The discussion leaders from Monday were able to
 meet, and decided on workshops to be scheduled throughout the term. Further communications
 will be sent to faculty via Faculty Notes with invitations to these events and a collective reading
 list.
 - Zeke and Jaime Babic presented a continuation from Monday on names, pronouns and gender identity (see presentation above). They reported that the College is committed to recognizing the preferred gender identity of students and to be consistent in their academic file. There is a name/pronoun update form that has been shared with faculty, but it is not meant to be a substitute for conversations between faculty and students. Faculty should consult the form results multiple times per term. Students' transcripts can be updated at any point in their time at Bennington or beyond.
 - Comments: Form should be in alphabetical order by last name. Students should also be aware that the form does not substitute a conversation. There could be a sentence in the google sheet explaining that there may be mistakes regarding they/them pronouns used grammatically. Students should also be aware that the form exists. There were concerns raised about grammar in outgoing transcripts, for the benefit of faculty and students. A suggestion was made to include pronoun preference as optional in the beginning of a class and to make using they/them a classroom practice for those who request it.

Commons Update and Planning :

Andy Schlatter reviewed the campus projects being worked on this spring. These projects include the preparation needed for Commons renovation, the expansion of the Student Center, and the relocation of certain offices.

During the Commons renovation, dining will shift to the Student Center, with Grab and Go moving to the Bookstore, laundry facilities will be only available within the student houses, and health/psych services will be housed in what was Brooder. Over Long Weekend, the Student Center will be closed to prepare for the shift in dining capacity. There will be extended dining hours in Commons that weekend, as well as a small cafe open in Down Commons. The Brooder renovation will be completed in May/June.

Institutional Advancement will be moving off campus to 210 South Street and there will be a conference space available if faculty wish to teach a class in town.

The Paran Creek apartments will be occupied in Fall 2017.
