There will be an opportunity for students to talk with Mr. Atherton about his work at 7:30 p.m. on Wednesday in the Exhibiation Gallery.

Mr. Atherton spent his youth in the far west, and studied at the California School of Fine Arts in San Francisco. He served in the Navy in World War I and worked in mines in Idaho, in shipyards, and as a jazz musician before embarking on a career in art. He has had one-man shows at the Julien Levy Galleries and Durlacher Bros. in New York, the Museum of Art in San Francisco, and as part of a group show at the Museum of Modern Art in New York, His pictures hang in the permanent collection of the Metropolitan, the Museum of Modern Art and the Whitney Museum in New York, the Pennsylvania Academy, the Chicago Art Institute and others. He has won a number of prizes and awards, including first prize at the Bohemian Club, San Francisco, fourth prize at the Artists for Victory Show in New York, and first and second prizes in the poster competition, Museum of Modern Art.

Other Exhibits:

Lawrence Art Museum, Williamstown, Mass.

An exhibit of silver opened on May 13th showing one hundred odd pieces, including the works of fifty-four of the most famous English silversmiths. This exhibition serves as the first public announcement of the Robert Sterling Clark Art Institute of Williamstown, Mass. This Institute has been established primarily for educational purposes and for the acquisition, preservation and exhibition of objects of art of every description. Pending the erection of a museum in Williamstown, the Institute plans to sponsor a series of exhibitions of art objects from their collections, to be held at Williams College. This exhibit is the first of the series.
