Friday, May 12, 1953 Saturday, May 13, 1953 9:00 p.m. The Theatre L'Invitation Au Chateau, as the original play was called, is one of Anouilh's Pieces Roses (as contrasted with his Pieces Noires).

"The society of the shell-pink world Anouilh dreamed of in his shell-pink plays is more neatly catalogued and oven smaller than the world of the Guermantes in Proust...In each of these plays he established a world of the remote and introduced a character who brings a breath of fresh air. That outsider is invariably a young bourgeoise.

"In Leocadia a young millinor's assistant is summoned to a chateau where an eccentric Dutchess teaches her to assume the identity of a beautiful deceased seprane...In La Repetition yet another young girl' is engaged as governess in yet another chateau and asked to take part in a charace that is to begin in the middle of a large dinner party."

"Unlike so many present-day playwrights who are descendants of a literary school, Anouilh is in the tradition of the commedia dell'arte. His plays are recorded improvisations...We realized that an English audience might have difficulty catching the spirit of the play; We had to find a sub-title. A comedy? A farce? A ballet? Then Fry found the answer. 'Call it a charade with music.'"
