Report of the Provost and Dean of the College

Isabel Roche

- Isabel suggested that faculty read the Faculty Notes to review the new hires for Fall 2017. There will be two new faculty administrative positions in the Dean's office. Terry Creach will be staying on until December, and Laurie Kobik will take on the role of Dean of Studies.
- Faculty should respond to Nicole Arrington with their plans for attendance at the Commencement dinner.
- Michael Cohen will be leading a religious literacy workshop in CAPA in the afternoons this fall for students, faculty, and staff modeled on Yale's Divinity School's online course. There will also be a review of religious archival documents from the College.
- Faculty are encouraged to be accommodating to students whom celebrate Ramadan, which falls at end of term. If faculty hear any concerns from students, they should forward those concerns to Nicole Arrington in Communications.
- Zeke gave a presentation on the Retention Lab. He outlined the importance of retention and the objectives and progress of the Retention Lab. He gave examples of changes that have been enacted to support students, mostly around advising. He reviewed how many students will be graduating, reasons for leaving, and the demographics of those who leave. He also showed how retention rates have increased because of an increased attention to students at risk.

• There will be a First Year Forum pilot launched in Fall 2017 with five faculty, five upperclassmen, and around fifteen new students. The students will be preparing for the Plan and transitioning to College. Feedback from faculty would be appreciated. Future initiatives will also be materializing over the summer regarding co-curricular work and advanced work.

Report of the President

- Hung Bui gave a presentation on the Bennington Class of 2021. Travel to prospective schools/ fairs was increased by up to 38%. There was an increase in applications to 1458. Admissions rates dropped to 56.25%. Yield from Bennington works was 53% (59% including those who had deposited). There will be 231 students from 31 states and 25 countries. 71% will be women. Liam Daley discussed how their rankings are calculated academically and holistically and went over the numbers on the new class makeup.
- Mass MOCA will be opening a new show this weekend, faculty involvement includes Mary Lum and Nick Brooke.
- Andy Schlatter gave an update on what will be happening this summer.
 - Commons will remain active until the end of June. The renovation will start in July.
 - The new student health center will be opening in mid to late June. The Student Center will be opening for dining in July.
 - Paran Creek Apartments will be opening this fall and a new path will be constructed in the summer.
 - Institutional Advancement is now in Downtown Bennington.
 - The mailroom will be relocating to the EAC and the mailboxes will be in the Barn.
