The Community Council met in the Committee dining room on Tuesday, Narch 19th. Freshmen

It was stated at the Council meeting that the Freshmen did not understand the Community Government of Bennington College and therefore it seemed advisable to the Council to straighten this matter out with the Freshmen. It was suggested that the House Chaormen have meetings withtheir Freshmen and explain the meaning of Community Government again. It was noted that this had been explained to them during the first week of College by Mr. Leigh but that most of the Freshmen had not understood completely. It was decided that the reason that they had not understood was because they had not had experience with these committees and therefore the emplination meant very little. The Council suggested then that a meeting to explain the running of Bennington be held in December when they were more accustomed to College and when their work was well under way. The running of the Gooperative Store and the usefulness of the EPC was to be stressed too at the meeting and all the council was urged to get suggestions from the Freshmen about how they think these matters should be presented in the fall.

The question of students' restlessness was discussed and the council was asked to find out, if possible, whether this was due to the present war situation or an unsatisfied need in College activities. It was suggested that this might be due to a lack of work or to the fact that Bennington was not quite what they had expected. This was to be brought up to the EPC as well to see if they could help in solving this problem.

Fire Chief

The duties of the Fire Chief were listed and then Alicia Ruhl presented the names of Doréa Higgins, Rosamond Reed, and Betty Uptegrove as nominees for this position. They were discussed and the Council elected Betty Uptegrove for this position for 1941.
