A meeting of the College Council was held on Mondey, June 21st, 1943 at 5:15 p.m. in the Student Lounge. The mosting was called for the purpose of discussing the advisability of a free weekend over July 4th. Members of the Council felt that such a break was very necessary both for students and faculty. Some members were of the opinion that this break should come earlier in the semester and this should be kept in mind for next year. It was also pointed out that such a free weekend might not be cooperating with the O.D.T.'s travel suggestions. However, the general opinion of the committee was that girls need not go away that weekend and in fact might be urged through the College Week to remember the warning against holiday travel. Mr. Lydenberg has been consulted about farm work for the weekend and will make suitable arrangements. Dance classes will be held as usual over the weekend because of the Special Students. The Council voted to declare a free weekend, with classes and individual conferences cancelled for Saturday, July 3rd and Mondey, July 5th.
