

### Community Meeting

The Community met in the theatre on Wednesday, March 6.

The following amendent to the organization of the Bennington College Community was accepted. (Minutes of November 5, 1934)

A: That for this year at least no attempt be made to print the Bennington College Publication;

That it be issued once a semester in typed form, as it was in June, 1934, with the possible addition of a copy in the living room of each student house, to facilitate reading;

That it contain, as heretofore stated, the work of special interest that has been done in any field; the best original work in literature and art; and an editorial section containing letters and articles of general interest;

That it be a community publication - not solely from the students - where the best written work of the whole Community is published;

That in accordance with the present policy copies of the best papers written which are too long for inclusion in this publication be placed in the library and listed under some catalogue or index;

That this typed material be directed at a campus audience only;

And, therefore, that Section Iv, Part F, of the Permanent Organization of the Bennington College Community be amended to read as follows:

#### F. The Editorial Board.

1. The Board shall consist of four student members, three literary editors and one art editor, at least one of whom shall have served on a previous board. It shall be appointed the first week in October and the first week in March in the following manner: The retiring Board shall submit to the Council proposed names for a complete Board, chosen with the advice of members of the faculty, and shall meet with the Council to discuss these and any other names that may be suggested. Afterward the Council shall at its own discretion appoint the Board.

2. The function of the Editorial Board shall be to issue once a semester a publication containing work illustrative of as many activities of the Community as possible, which is to be placed for reading on the campus only.
