HIKE TO LYE BROOK FALLS IN THE GREEN MOUNTAIN NATIONAL FOREST



The hiking trail follows the bed of a former logging railroad up a gradual slope parallel to Lye Brook, taking you to the cascading 125-foot Lye Brook Falls, one of Vermont's highest waterfalls. Transportation for this trip is limited to 14 people (directions for carpoolers available in the Office of Student Life) and the cost is \$5, which includes transportation, a water bottle, insect repellent, and a peanut-free snack.
