**INCARCERATION IN AMERICA.** Higher education in prison improves the ability of those released to find employment, and greatly reduces the likelihood of recidivism. Since the 1994 Omnibus Crime Bill, the responsibility of such education in prisons has fallen to colleges and universities, usually partly underwritten by the private sector. Several professionals working in the field will participate in this think tank to consider the ways in which liberal arts colleges can further contribute to higher education in prisons.
