Among his numerous articles and books, Reclaiming the Commons: Community Farms and Forests in New England won the Historic New England Prize, and The Great Meadow: Farmers and the Land in Colonial Concord won multiple awards including the George Perkins Marsh Prize from the American Society of Environmental History. He recently co-authored A New England Food Vision (www.nefoodvision.org), which lays out an advocacy plan for New England to produce 50% of its own food by 2060.
