Need help planning your FWT? Book an advising session (http://bennington.genbook/com/) to get help with resumewriting, FWT budgeting, customized WorkLink searches, and more. The office also hosts general walk-in hours Tuesdays and Wednesdays, 12:00 noon-2:00 pm, and walk-in hours for seniors Thursdays, 12:00 noon-2:00 pm. Director Faith McClellan's open office hours are Thursdays, 1:00-2:00 pm.

The FWT Office currently has over 600 FWT openings posted on WorkLink, and the WorkLink Document library includes a "FWT Job Archives" of past FWT listings, organized by field. You can also save a customized search (e.g. filtered by location or keyword or compensation).

Google announced recently that it will end support for the Google Drive desktop apps for Windows and Mac computers on December 11, 2017 and that the software will be shut down for good on March 12, 2018. This app will be replaced by the Drive Stream app for Windows and Mac. The program can be set to synchronize copies of locally stored photos and other files on the computer to Google's cloud servers, and to allow you to work offline on your Google files.
