An Homage To Marc Blitzstein The Carriage Barn / Bennington College 6 June 1964 at 8:30 pm Marc Blitzstein was born in Philadelphia in March 1902. He was in, his own words, a 'brat prodigy', playing the piano by ear at the age of three and making his first public appearance at the age of six. He attented the University of Pennsylvania from 1921 to 1923. Later he studied with Scalero, Silotti, Nadia Boulanger, Schnböerg. In 1933 he married Eva Goldbeck, who died in 1936. His major works include Gods (1926); Piano Sonata (1927); Triple Sec (1928); Parabola and Circula (1929); String Quartet, Cain (1930); Stuffed Seaweed, Piano Concerto, The Harpies (1931); Serenade for String Quartet (1932); Variations for Orchestra (1934); Children's Cantata (1935); Chesapeake Bay Retriever, The Cradle Will Rock (1936); music for Orson Welles's production of Julius Caesar, I've Got the Tune, No For A Answer, The Spanish Earth (1937); Valleytown (1940); Native Land (1941); Night Shift (1942); Freedom Morning (1943); The Airborne (1946); music for Androcles And The Lion & Another Part Of The Forest (1947); Regina, The Guests (1949); music for King Lear (1951); adaptation-translation of The Threepenny Opera (1952); Reuben, Reuben (1954); This Is The Garden (1957); music for A Midsummer Night's Dream &The Winter's Tale (1958); music for Toys In The Attic (1960); Idiot's First, The Magic Barrel, Sacco and Vanzetti (1963). He died in Martinique in January 1964.
