Black Poet To Read Works At College Tuesday Night

Don C. Lee, plack poet, will read his poetry at Bennington College Tuesday, May 13 at 8:30 p.m. in Barn I. The public is invited and there is no admission charge.

Lee is black writer-in-residence at Cornell University. He is on leave from his duties as a staff member of the Museum of African-American History and instructor of Afro-American literature at Columbia College in Chicago.

Lee has published three books of poetry, "Think Black!" "Black Pride" and "Don't Cry, Scream." His poems and articles have appeared in Negro Digest, Journal of Black Poetry, Evergreen Review, Freedomways and The New York Times, among other journals and newspapers. He is working on an autobiographical novel, a collection of essays, some short stories, and a book on poetry and black art in collaboration with Omar Lama.

As an active member of the Organization of Black American Culture, Lee participates in its Writers' Workshop, an organization composed of a group of Chicago ghetto artists who promote black-oriented art and culture.
